



2009 GENERAL ASSEMBLY - BILLS OF INTEREST
Updated through March 20, 2009

The Georgia General Assembly convened the 2009 session on January 11, 2009 with all members concerned about the impending FY 2009 and FY 2010 budget crisis. House Resolution 565 provides for the General Assembly to convene on 23, 25, 26, and 30, April 1 and to adjourn on April 3—the 40th legislative day.

The following table provides information on bills of interest that has been introduced through March 20th in the 2009 General Assembly Session. **Changes and updates since March 13th, are highlighted in red.**

Bill Number	Short Description	Status (3/20/09)
SB 3	Requires the Commissioner of Insurance to oversee the operation of pharmacy benefits managers (PBM), including the ones used by the State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP). The response to a request for prior authorization must be completed within 24 hours, step-therapy must be used for medications excluded from the preferred drug list, and a physician must be reimbursed when prior approvals exceed 10 in a 30-day period, at the rate of \$10 per approval.	Assigned to Senate Insurance & Labor (I&L) Committee 1/14/09.
SB 122	Amends the Code to separate the Georgia Retiree Health Benefit Fund into two separate funds—the Georgia State Retiree Health Benefit Fund and the Georgia School Retiree Health Benefit Fund. The Committee Substitute establishes two Trust funds with the same provisions for each, except for liability provision. The bill provides for local school systems to be liable for the post-employment costs for teachers and school personnel retirees, and for state agencies (subject to appropriations) to be liable for the post-employment costs for state retirees. DCH shall identify the funds to be placed in each fund as of August 31, 2009.	Favorably Reported by House Retirement Committee on 3/18/09.
SB 129 and HB 249	Amends Public Retirement Systems Investment Authority Law to allow retirement funds to be placed in “alternative investments”. Applies to large retirement systems, including the Employees Retirement System (ERS), <u>but not</u> the Teachers Retirement System (TRS). <i>See GSRA’s Feb. 13 Action Alert! HB 249 amended to apply only to the Firefighters Pension Plan.</i>	SB 129 assigned to Senate Retirement Committee 2/10/09. HB 249 favorable reported by House Retirement Committee 3/9/09.
SB 161 & HB 426	Amends the insurance code and the State Health Benefit Plan code to require coverage of autism.	SB 161 tabled by Senate. HB 426 assigned to House Insurance Committee 2/17/09.
SB 171	Amends the retirement code to require divestiture of investments in companies doing business with Sudan.	Assigned to Senate Retirement Committee

SB 257 & HB 740	Allows a Board of Regent faculty member or principal administrator to revoke his/her choice to participate in the Board of Regents optional retirement plan.	Assigned to the respective Retirement Committees on 3/18/09.
SB 260	Allows any school system employee to join the Teachers Retirement System.	Assigned to the Senate Retirement Committee on 3/18/09.
HB 54	Amends the Georgia Judicial Retirement System to allow members who initially rejected spouses' benefits to elect such benefits by paying an actuarially determined amount.	Assigned to House Retirement Committee 1/15/09.
HB 89	House Committee substituted the bill to define Radiologist Assistant.	Favorable Reported by House Committee on 3/18/09.
HB 118	Amends the Supplemental FY 2009 Appropriations Act	Governor signed into law.
HB 119	Appropriations Act for FY 2010. House amended the bill to continue cost-sharing in the State Health Benefit Plan at 75%.	House passed and Senate assigned to Senate Appropriations on 3/20/09.
HB 171	Provides that public disclosure will not required for personal contact information of individuals obtained by local governments.	After passage by House assigned to Senate Governmental Oversight.
HB 172	Amends the ERS law to require the periodic re-examination of a disability beneficiary to be performed by a physician designated by the ERS medical board and to include workers' compensation payments to the exclusions in the amount earnable by the beneficiary.	Favorably reported by the Senate Retirement Committee on 3/18/09.
HB 190	Amends ERS to provide that the benefit payment for persons reappointed and who decease with at least 10 years of service shall be based upon the creditable service on the date of death. The bill allows the ERS	Passed House on 2/17/09, read by Senate 2/18/09 and assigned to Senate Retirement Committee.

HB 210	Clarifies provisions for the Judicial Retirement System and preserves the prior rights of certain attorneys employed by the Legislative Counsel or the Department of Law.	Passed Senate on 3/19/09.
HB 211	Amends the retirement code for the state supported retirement systems to assure that Fulton County is the exclusive jurisdiction of any action against the respective retirement systems.	Favorably reported on 2/4/09. Recommitted to House Retirement Committee on 2/24/09
HB 228	Changes the Department of Human Resources to establish two new departments: Department of Public and Behavioral Health and Department of Human Services and reassigns various functions of the current DHR to the new Departments. Senate Committee restored the original provisions to establish three new departments. See SB 222.	Favorably Reported by Senate Committee.
HB 345	Changes the vesting provisions for the Teachers Retirement System from 10 to 5 years of service.	Assigned to House Retirement Committee 2/10/09.

HB 605	The Transforming Transportation Act to abolish the State Road & Tollway Authority and create the State Transportation Agency and State Transportation Authority. The act changes the role of the Transportation Authority and transfers many of the Transportation Board duties to the State Transportation Authority. HB 671	Allows furloughed State employees to continue to accumulate sick and annual leave as though they were not furloughed.	Assigned to House State Institutions & Property on 3/5/09
HB 739	Allows service credit for an Assistant District Attorney to buy credit under certain conditions at a cost not to create an unfunded liability.	Assigned to the House Retirement Committee on 3/18/09.
HR 642	Establish a Study Committee to study the Regional Educational Service Agencies (RESAs) services and assistance to local school systems and other educational institutions.	Assigned to House Education Committee 3/18/09.
